## HOH AUDITORIUM UPGRADE PROJECT



The consultant phase was completed in 2024. The reports and conferences from Troy Reit / VIP Northwest Productions, Justin Schmidt, and Bob Webb will be utilized to develop a strategic plan and prioritize auditorium and stage updates in the future. Monies awarded by the 2024 ArtsFund grant

were used to purchase 2 new choral microphones sets, just in time for the school's concerts. With your support, we will continue to enhance the performance space to attract a variety of events for your enjoyment.



## HARRINGTON OPERA HOUSE AND BANK BLOCK BUILDING

#### Work on the building continues.

In February, Icon Roofing repaired three roof leaks caused by ice damage over the winter. D.R. Integrity repaired and repainted the interior walls that were damaged by the water. They also closed up and repainted the section of the Art Room ceiling that was removed during phase one of the south wall project.

Talisman Construction Services returned to complete phase two of the south wall stabilization by repositioning and re-pointing the damaged exterior brickwork.

D.R. Integrity started the process of rehabilitating the "rummage room". We were able to continue using the room for rummages while they took down the sub-ceiling, insulated and sheet rocked the original ceiling, and built new walls to reconfigure the layout of the area. During the year, folks coming to a rummage fundraiser were able to actually see their donations dollars at work. The treasures they found had the added value of some vintage dust!

### **PMGLLC** ANNEX

Work began in earnest on the south PMGLLC Annex building that was built in 1902.

The apartment (211 Wills St) and front corner of the south building (18 South  $3^{RD}$ ) are the first priority. Most of the

needed demolition has been completed. The original arched south window was uncovered by removing a wall that had been built in the 50's. The layout of the apartment has been modified a bit to add closets and a larger utility and bathroom.

We plan to have an open house walk through tour in the spring. It will be exciting to remove the white wood façade that was built to cover the large windows on 3rd street. We are also eager for the community to see the progress and invite their involvement going forward.



### **RUMMAGE FUNDRAISER**

- Saturday, May 17 Beautiful quilts will be showcased during the annual Studebaker Car Show.


• On June 21 during Harrington's Vintage Country

Fair the 1904 Opera House and Bank Block Building will be celebrated as we focus on its grandeur and history.


